ENDO- PERIO LESION

Primary endodontic lesion



It is endodontic in nature, but the lesion happens to be draining through the gingival tissue.

Primary endodontic lesion with secondary periodontal involvement



It occurs when a primary endodontic infection persists, destroys the surrounding tissue and infiltrates into the inter-radicular space.

Primary periodontal lesion



It is the classic appearance of periodontal disease where pocket formation occurs due to plaque or calculus accumulation leading to loss of attachment.

Primary periodontal lesion with secondary endodontic involvement



It happens when periodontal disease progresses down the root surface and leads to an area of communication with the pulp

Combined lesion



This diagnosis can be given when the two separate processes have started independent of each other but happen to coalesce

Concomitant pulpalperiodontal lesion



It represents the presentation of both pulpal and periodontal conditions on the same tooth which appear to exist independent of each other
